Our Legacy

- O Dar Al Ajaza is the outcome of 64+ years of hard work and dedication of a group of individuals who share the same vision. Lebanon's Independence Leader and first Prime Minister Riad El-Solh had a vision to establish an important institution. Mr. Omar Al-Daouk President of Makassed donated the land, and PM Hajj Hussein Al Oueini initiated the launching of DAIH.
- The Lebanese community lacked an institution that provided shelter for the elderly and the needy. By a special decree (#24) issued by the Lebanese Government, DAI became a legal non-profit institution in 1952.

Our Identity

Dar Al Ajaza was established as a non-profit charitable organization of public interest in 1952. It shelters and cares for the elderly and the disabled by providing superior medical care and treatment for patients with mental disabilities and nervous disorders. Resident patients are from all age groups (disregarding their gender, nationality, religion, social, or economical status) and from different locations around Lebanon, plus some are from neighboring countries.



Our Vision, Mission & Core Values


Mission






Refugee Camps

- University students doing internships










Teaching Hospital

- More than 12,000 university students have attended DAI's teaching program during the last twenty years.















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
Continuous Education

Geriatrics is our main specialty.

With the help of our specialized physicians, it focuses on promoting the healthcare and wellbeing of our elderly patients by treating diseases and providing the appropriate care.

Our elderly division provides healthcare for more than 300 resident-patients suffering from age-associated diseases such as arteriosclerosis, cardiovascular disease, cancer, arthritis, cataracts, osteoporosis, type 2diabetes, hypertension, and Alzheimer's disease.












Mental Illness

 - social










Mental Illness

Palliative Care

- The **Palliative Care** Unit was launched in DAI Hospital in March 2008
- It's a pioneer center in the long term institutions
- We served till now about 150 patients
- This unit can accommodate up to 10 patients at the same time, most of whom are intubated. However we also take care of the terminally ill patients such as cancer and late stage Alzheimer...

Our main objectives are to:

- Treat patients with dignity
- Provide excellent patient care with the best quality of life
- Support for the patients and their family members
- Reduce significantly all symptoms the patient suffers from such as pain, dyspnea, nausea constipation, anorexia, depression...










Palliative Care



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Clinics and Diagnostic Centers

In-House Facilities

- Our high-tech kitchen prepares 3,000 meals per day for patients (3 meals + 2 snacks).
- Our nutrition department plans all the meals.
- Our laundry section cleans 1,000 kg of clothes on a daily basis + tailoring workshop.
- The RO purification system allows 300 m³ of treated water to be used for cooking, cleaning, and laundry. The heating systems provide hot and warm water whenever they are needed.
- The maintenance team and 3 engineers are available 24 hours a day to tackle any technical issues.







Patients & Visitors' Amenities and Activities



Gardens: we have provided an eco-friendly environment with green spaces for patients, visitors, and staff to enjoy.



Social entertainment spaces: we have tailor-made social and entertainment areas, including thoughtful games that will benefit patients' wellbeing



Physiotherapy: available for patients to use with our expert physiotherapists



Patients & Visitors' Amenities & Activities



Outdoor trips and special-occasion celebrations: enable patients invited to outdoor trips and excursions on a weekly basis



Occupational Therapy is provided to our patients in order to improve physical, motor and cognitive capacities with independence. It takes place on environment adaptation.



Library: facility open for staff, researchers, students and capable patients who enjoy reading in their free time

Financial Situation




The DAI Hospital requires 12 million USD per year to cover its expenses



40% of this budget is received from MOH and 60% of this budget is based on donations, grants and fundraising.



Fundraising is crucial to DAIH's patients' support.





Challenges

- Space vs. Patients
- Staff ratio vs. number of patients
- 40% of the budget depends on the support of MOH
- 60% of the budget depends on donations, grants, and fundraising
- Unstable surroundings (refugee camps all around)
- Lack of international NGO support
- Unsustainable fund raising model



Future Strategies and Tactics


- Enhance the image of DAI through digital marketing and social media strategies
- Affiliate DAI with regional and international NGOs
- Secure sustainable fundraising
- Initiate medical conferences on a yearly basis
- Initiate public health awareness campaigns
- Initiate a yearly Geriatrics Conference and Gala Dinner to raise funds and awareness.
